Eligibility: Open to 4-H/FFA horse members 14-18 years of age as of **January 1, 2023** who have completed at least one year of 4-H or FFA. Previous Horse Royalty winners are ineligible to participate.

Entry Deadline: Contestant entries with photo must be mailed to Franklin County Extension Office, Attn: 4-H Horse Royalty, 2548 Carmack Road Columbus, Ohio 43210. Entries must be received by **April 1, 2023** and include a \$30.00 application fee payable to Franklin County 4-H Horse Advisory and a picture of yourself. Contest Components: The Horse Royalty Program is based on completion of the following:

- A. The first meeting scheduled for Thursday **April 12, 2023 at 7PM** (location to be determined) is mandatory attendance. Exception: If candidate is unable to attend, they must notify Veronica Boysel, Royalty Committee Advisor, that they have made arrangements to have a parent, guardian, or 4-H club Advisor attend in their place on their behalf. Provided this notice is received one week prior to the mandatory meeting, there will be no penalty assessed. Notification can be sent to Veronica Boysel at 614-216-1773. NOTE: If you miss the mandatory meeting and did not notify Royalty Advisor you will be disqualified from Royalty Competition and forfeit your \$30.00 application fee. If you are late to the meeting a 5 pt deduction will be given, if you are more than 15 minutes late a 10 pt. deduction will be given or you may be disqualified from Royalty Competition and forfeit your \$30.00
- B. Participation in one Royalty Showmanship class at a Franklin County Horse Advisory show **on May 7th or June 10th**. If you participate in both Horse Advisory shows, the best score will be used. You will be judged against standards, NOT against each other.
- C. Participation in one Royalty Horsemanship or Equation class at a Franklin County Horse Advisory Show **on May 7th or June 10th**. Chaps are permitted but not required. If you participate in both Horse Advisory shows, the best score will be used. You will be judged against standards, NOT against each other.
- D. Volunteering for the Franklin County 4-H Horse Advisory Committee is required. All candidates must volunteer for **at least one** Horse Advisory Show to be eligible for the volunteering points. We have chosen to fulfill this requirement this year by setting and removing both the jumps and the trail course at the shows on **May 7th and June 10th**. You must be present for all the set up and removals to earn full points.

- E. Royalty Essay must be emailed to kathymyers@columbus.rr.com by **July 5, 2023 at noon**, and your essay must be displayed in a Frame by 8AM on **July 17, 2023** on your Stall door.
- F. All candidates must declare their riding seat on the Royalty entry application, (this is the seat you will compete in for the riding points) If the horse is unable to compete at the time of the qualifying shows or a make-up show as determined by Royalty Advisors, you will forfeit your points for this event. You may not substitute or borrow another horse.
- G. Participation in one Royalty Ride-in at a Franklin County Horse Advisory show is required. Candidates are to dress in appropriate show attire of their respective declared seat with club sash. Candidates will be introduced per submitted bio, and are required to either lead or ride their horse project into the ring. (5 point deduction for not having proper riding attire of their respective declared seat, tack or sash for ride in) If you are late to the ride-in a 5 pt deduction will be given, a 10 pt deduction will be given for missing ride in
- H. Royalty Luncheon: **June 28, 2023 11:00 a.m.** is mandatory and must be attended from start of luncheon to finish. **4635 Trueman Blvd. Hilliard Ohio 43026** If you are late to the Luncheon a 5 pt deduction will be given, if you are more than 15 minutes late a 10 pt deduction will be given or you may be disqualified from Royalty Competition and forfeit your \$30.00
- a. Submission of an Autobiography must be submitted at the Horse Royalty Luncheon.
 - b. 10 minute Interview will also take place for each candidate with two judges.
 - c. Written Test over project books: Safety and you, Beginning horse management, Dressage, and #179 Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Shows.
- I. *Horse Requirements: All royalty candidates must have a horse project on special exhibit at the Franklin County Junior Fair and participate in Horse grading.
All royalty candidates will be stalled with their 4-H club or FFA chapter and must have their royalty frame and essay on stall exhibit.*
- J. Ties: Ties are allowed for showmanship, horsemanship, equitation, autobiography, interview, test in first, second and third runner up placings. In the event that there is a tie for the winner, the following tie breakers will be used, in the following order:
- d. The highest test score will be the winner. If there is still a tie for the winner then...
 - e. The interview scores will be used. If the interview score still does not break the tie...
 - f. The Autobiography score will be used. If there is still a tie
 - g. The Showmanship score will be used.
- K. Coronation: **Monday, July 17, 2023.** Dress is semi-formal for all contestants. Awards for the Horse Royalty Contest are acquired by the Advisors and are paid for by sponsorships obtained by the candidates and/ or the 4-H Horse Advisory Committee.
- L. Horse Royalty Scoring (**must complete at least 6 to participate in the crowning ceremony**)

*Best score will be used if you participate in both Horse Advisory shows.

** A deduction of 5 points will be made for:

- Being late to mandatory meeting but less than 15 minutes late.
- not being in the proper show attire of your declared seat for each ride in
- **not having proper tack** of your respective declared seat for each ride in
- **not wearing your sash** for each ride in
- being late to meetings, ride ins or Luncheon

** A deduction of 10 points will be made for:

- More than 15 minutes late to the mandatory meeting
- more than 15 minutes late to meetings or Luncheon
- missing the ride in

Forfeit of Candidacy and \$30 application fee:

- If any candidate fails to attend mandatory meeting, and fails to notify either ROYALTY ADVISOR (Kathy or Veronica) one week prior to the meeting, that candidate is considered to have forfeited their right to participate in the royalty program for that given year.
- Failure to complete at least 6 of the scoring categories. In order to participate in the crowning ceremony, all candidates must complete at least 6 of the 8 categories for points.
