

Franklin County 4-H 2023 Pre-Fair Packet

This packet of information is provided so that 4-H families can get through the 4-H project evaluation process with an increased knowledge of what to expect. Included in the packet are:

- 1. Information and links for members to sign-up for their appointment times.
- 2. Schedules for club duties such as Ganyard Building Watch, Burke Building Cleanup, and Pop Stand Shifts
- 3. Other 4-H and fair event information

Evaluation Schedule: The evaluation schedule is developed using the number of 4-H members enrolled in a given 4-H project. It is difficult for us to predict what percentage of 4-H members will participate in county evaluations. Please exercise some patience and flexibility when waiting for your judging time. Our goal is that everyone has a positive and equitable evaluation experience.

Evaluation Check-In: Exhibitors should arrive 15 minutes prior to their scheduled project evaluation judging time to complete check-in procedures at the Activities Tent (Edwards Building for Companion Animal Day).

Criteria for Non-Livestock Judging: The judging/evaluation process will include:

- A. An interview with a judge(s)
- B. Exhibition of a project item(s) and/or educational display
- C. A completed project book
- D. Optional: Participation in a skills component (for livestock projects to be eligible for Premier Livestock Exhibitor)
- E. All score sheets and blue/red/white ribbons for non-livestock projects will be distributed after seeing the judge.

Required Exhibit Display: All exhibitors are required to place their project exhibit or something to represent their project in their club booth or the countywide 4-H booth located in the Ganyard Building.

Awards: Recognition awards of blue, red and white ribbons will be given at the discretion of the judge. These will be presented at the end of the interview. Some projects will receive additional ribbons for Outstanding and Superior work. These are given at the judge's discretion. State Fair Selection and Alternates or Best of Class, Best of Show and Honorable Mention, where appropriate, will be selected by the judges after all evaluations have been done for a given class. Only members with a completed project book and blue ribbon will be eligible for the above-mentioned awards.



Understanding Junior Fair Non-Livestock Awards

State Fair Selection

Generally, each non-livestock 4-H project has an overall winner for the project. This individual is given the opportunity to represent Franklin County with their project at the Ohio State Fair. Recipients of this award will receive a rosette, along with a state fair packet that includes a ticket to the OSF, a letter for check-in, and a copy of the judging criteria to prepare for their evaluation. Individuals who are not able to attend the OSF should return their packet immediately to Beth or Rachel during the fair or drop it off at the Extension Office with all of the contents, ready to pass on to the State Fair Alternate award winner. We ask that you do this in a timely manner so that the alternate has enough time to prepare for their evaluation.

State Fair Alternate

Selected as the overall second place winner in their project, this individual is on deck to attend the Ohio State Fair in the event that the State Fair Selection winner cannot attend. Recipients will receive a rosette and a ticket to the 4-H Pop Stand to be used during the Franklin County Fair.

Best of Class

The Best of Class award is given to individuals who are deemed the overall winner for their project but do not have the ability to present their project at the Ohio State Fair because the classes aren't offered there. Recipients of this award will receive a rosette and a ticket to the pop stand to be used during the Franklin County Fair.

Honorable Mention

These awards, while not the winning project, are presented to individuals that are deemed worthy of special recognition. They are given at the judge's discretion.

Thank You Notes

Junior Fair awards always come with a blank thank you note. It is your responsibility to write a note and place it in the thank you note basket located in the Ganyard Building.

Write a Meaningful Thank You Note

Junior Fair awards always come with a blank thank you note. It is your responsibility to write a note and place it in the thank you note basket located in the Ganyard Building.

Why Thank You's?

The purpose of a thank you note is to show your gratitude for a gift in which your have received. In the case of a Junior Fair thank you note, you are writing to thank a business or an individual who sponsored your award/ribbon/t-shirt or purchased your animal at the livestock auction.

Whether it is a livestock trophy or rosette, a state fair selection award, a junior fair t-shirt, or a buyer at the livestock auction, a member of the community decided to donate funds for your benefit, so it is important to say thank you! The best practice is to send your thank you note within one week of receiving your award or selling your project in the auction.

Your Thank You Note Should Include

- A Greeting:
 - Dear Mr. and Ms.(Last Name of Donor) or Dear (Name of Local Business)
- ☐ The Thank You:
 - Thank you for purchasing my 2020 market rabbit and for supporting the Franklin County Junior Fair.
 - Thank you for sponsoring my junior fair t-shirt this year. I apricate your generosity and can't wait to show off my shirt!
- What You Learned:
 - This year I focused my knowledge on nutrition. I attended a rabbit clinic where I learned about rabbit diets and how to better care for my rabbit project.
 - This year I completed a food and nutrition project. I learned a lot about food safety. I am excited to put that knowledge to use at an upcoming picnic.
- Closing:
 - Thank you again for your donation! Your support has made a difference in so many lives.

Thank you for coming to the auction this year and purchasing my goat. I really appreciate your generosity and support of the 4-H program.

This was my first year raising a goat for fair. I learned a lot about how to feed him properly and how to groom my goat. 4-H has been a great place to make new friends and learn new skills.

Addressing the Thank You Note Envelope

When addressing an envelope, accuracy matters. If your envelope is addressed incorrectly your letter could be delayed or returned to you.

1. Return Address


The return address on an envelope outlines information about the sender, in this case, that would be you. It is important to include a return address on your envelope in case your mail delivery would need to be returned to you. The return address should be written on the top left corner of the envelope. You should include your name, street address and your city, state (abbreviations are okay, but only capitals letters) and your zip code. This section is typically written smaller.

2. Recipient Address

The recipient address on an envelope outlines information about the receiver of your note. In this case, that could be a livestock sale buyer or an award sponsor. You will need to know the recipient's full name (or business name), their street address as well as their city, state (abbreviations are okay, but only capitals letters), and their zip code. This section is typically written bigger.

3. Stamp

The stamp should be placed in the top right-hand corner of your envelope. This let's the post office know that you have paid for the delivery of your letter. Stamps have a one-time use. If you need to buy stamps you can visit your local post office, order them online, or even get them at the grocery store.

All livestock projects members MUST BE EVALUATED prior to the fair or participation in the show at the fair will not be allowed. If you are unable to come to the evaluation day/time listed above (you must have a very important reason), then you may schedule a makeup evaluation by contacting Rachel Stoneburner at stoneburner.31@osu.edu_by Friday, July 7.

Participating in a makeup livestock evaluation will result in a <u>10-point deduction</u> in overall scores for the Premier Exhibitor contest, per Junior Fair Guidelines.

All Livestock: Sunday, July 16, 8:00AM-5:00PM

Enter: Gate 4 ONLY

Exit: Gate 4 (or Gate 5 until noon)

Livestock Release Time:

All Livestock: Sunday, July 22, 7:30PM (walkout), 8:30PM (vehicles)

Please park/unload on the East side of the Burke Bldg. or North side of the hog barn (bldg. #13 on below map). The north side of hog barn will only have a few spots available. Please be courteous to others and move vehicles when finished unloading animals and tack (supplies).

Animals can be placed directly into their pen(s)/stall(s). Market animal weigh-ins will start at 6PM. If you have both large and small (rabbits / poultry) livestock, please make sure you weigh your large animals first.

Drug Use Notification Forms:

All market animals must complete a Drug Use Notification Forms (DUNF) electronically, after weighs are completed. We will have iPads / laptops available for you to complete those online. Please make sure you bring the Fair Tag # from weigh-in to the DUNF entry station at the front of the Burke Building. This is the tag # used for these forms. There will be a volunteer available to assist with questions.

Goat, Sheep & Swine Fun Show

Junior Age Division – 8-13 as of 1/1/2023 Senior Age Division – 14-18 as of 1/1/2023

Class 1 – Costume Contest

Rules:

- 1. Any paint or coloring used on your animal must be washable. Costumes or paint that could cause harm to your animal are not permitted.
- 2. Costumes/Themes must be family friendly.

Class 2 – Timed Pole Bending

Rules:

- 1. Each exhibitor and animal must complete the course.
- 2. Missed poles will add 5 seconds to your final score.
- 3. Spacing of poles will be based on age divisions.
- * Awards will be determined on sponsorship donations received.

Poultry Exhibitors

If the animal was not purchased from a certified pullorum free hatchery it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the animal blood tested no more than 90 days prior to the fair and tested by an approved pullorum tester by the ODA, and certified that the animal is pullorum free prior to the fair. A copy of this certificate must be submitted to the Junior Fair Board prior to the fair. If you need testing done, please contact the Extension Office for contact information of testers at 614-866-6900, option 2.

Franklin County Fair 4-H Booth Criteria

4-H clubs may select from two booth sizes: Single booth - 8' W X 6' D | Double booth - 16' W by 6' D

Clubs are responsible for constructing and decorating their booth space. Every 4-H member exhibiting at the fair must display their project(s)/or a representation of it in the club's booth unless on exhibit in a livestock or horse barn.

Members' first names should be in the booth and on each project respectively, along with awarded ribbons. The project or representation needs to be displayed and in place before fair opens on the first day. Remember a project book does not constitute a display. See below for examples of project displays and representations.



Acceptable Project Displays



- Includes first name of member
- May be the display used for project evaluation
- Could be a visual (3D) representation of project subject
- Includes ribbons received for project evaluation
- Large picture of project













Unacceptable Project Displays



- A project book is not a display
- Should not be a piece of paper with name and project
- Firearms/weapons of any kind (working or non-working) are not allowed)
- Each project should have their own display not shared with other individuals.



Ganyard Booth Layout

- 1. Size: Each booth has an exact measurement allowed in the layout. Please stay within your 16- or 8-foot requested space. It is not fair to your neighbor to extend into their space
- **2. Electric:** Booths with a Black square in them on diagram have electricity available. Booths with electric were assigned on a first come basis.
- **3. Booth Set-Up**: Booths can be set up during the following hours: Friday, from 3-9 pm, Saturday, 9:00am 9:00 pm. All booths displays and decorations must be in place and ready to show by 9:00 PM Saturday before opening of fair
- **4. Theme:** Youth groups may choose their own theme
- 5. No Food or Animals Allowed: No food items or live animals are allowed in the booths.
- **6. Booth Display Requirements**: All Clubs must cover the back and sides of their Booths, if it shows in your neighbor's booth. Please use a solid color to cover the back and side of your booth.
- 7. **Booth Assembly Requirements**: No drilling, staples and tape is allowed on walls in Ganyard Building. You must bring your own backdrop for all booths.
- **8. Items Allowed In Booths:** Sand, sawdust, glitter, dirt, confetti is allowed in the booth only if it is contained in area and will not blow out into the aisle way. Baled straw or hay is allowed if covered in plastic.
- **9. Club Identification:** 4-H Club and 4-H member's first names should be in the booth and on each project respectively, along with the awarded ribbon. The project or representation needs to be displayed and in place before fair opens on the first day. Remember a **project book does not** constitute a display and should not be left in booths.
- **10. County Booth:** A County Booth is available for clubs who do not have an individual club booth. *Complete rules listed on Jr. Fair website:*





Clover Award Forms (project members only)

These simple award forms are easy to fill out. Just mark off the activities that you've participated in this year, add up your points, and find out if you've qualified for a Gold, Silver, or Bronze Clover Pin Award. It's all online!

Community Service, Leadership, & Public Speaking Awards (project members only) Community Service, Leadership, & Public Speaking award details are located on the Clover Award Form. Check off the activities that you've completed on each of these forms to see if you've qualified for one or all of these award pins.

Outstanding 4-H Member of the Year Award (project members only)

This competitive award is only given to a select few in each age category to honor those that have gone above and beyond in their 4-H experiences. Award reviewers compile scores from clover and pin awards, review project and 4-H experiences, and read the short response essays on the online application to select the winners of this award. Only those members who qualify for a Gold Pin and all of the Leadership, Public Speaking, and Community Service pins are eligible to apply for this honor.

<u>Cloverbud Pin Award</u> (Cloverbud members only)

Our youngest members in Kindergarten through second grade can complete this form to receive their Cloverbud Pin Award at the recognition program.
