## Vaccines

The following vaccines are considered “core” by the American Association of Equine Practitioners.

Vaccinations are required to be administered after March 1 to assure they provide adequate protection for the county fair.\*\*

- If **self-administering**: place the label from the vaccine vial in the space below, or otherwise attach the vaccine packaging that shows the lot number. Please write the date given.
- If being **administered by a vet**: staple your itemized receipt to the back of this form. If the receipt is not itemized to show what was given, this form is invalid.
- Often these vaccines come mixed into one shot. If you are self-administering, make sure to read the label and all instructions. Follow directions as written.

### Vaccination Protocol Standards are:

- Unvaccinated animals need an initial vaccine followed by a booster in 3 weeks.
- All previously vaccinated horses need only the booster vaccination.
- Rabies only need the annual dose. No booster in previously unvaccinated.

\*\*Respiratory viruses have shorter protection periods. Therefore if the Flu/Rhino vaccination is administered prior to March 1, it will not provide protection during the fair. Proof of a second Flu/Rhino booster will be required for the horse to be at fair.

## Coggins Test

A Coggins test is a blood test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA). This test requires blood to be drawn. Only a veterinarian can complete the test. Please attach a copy of your 2023 negative Coggins test. We recommend a copy so you can keep your original for your records. If printing electronic results, please include the entire form with your horse pictures/identification.
