Skill Level – Listed by Project

General Requirements

- ✿ Member must participate in Project Interviews (County or Club level) for the project to be considered completed for the 4-H year.
- ✿ Member must participate in a Project Interview during the Franklin County Fair, on the appropriate day, to be eligible to be considered for Ohio State Fair Selection.
- ✿ Member must display a representation of their project in their 4-H club fair booth.

Franklin County Creative Arts Projects Completion Requirements

Cake Decorating – Skill Level: N/A

1. All 5 Activities
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Record of decorating skills and techniques.
5. Completed Project Review and Summary.
6. An educational display on a topic from the project book.
7. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.



My Favorite Things – Beginner

1. All 8 Activities
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Documentation and/or research about your collection.
5. Completed Project Review.
6. Your collection or part of your collection. (A picture is acceptable if you collection cannot be transported.) An educational display on a topic from the project book, if you do not bring you collection.
7. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.

Quilting the Best Better – Intermediate

1. All 8 Activities and all Quilting Quotes questions
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review.
5. Quilt blocks, a pillow to be donated, and a lap quilt (minimum 30" x 30" and maximum 54" x 72")
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.
7. Quilt projects must be shown in the Franklin County Fair Style Review and Quilt Show.

You Can Quilt! – Intermediate

1. All 7 Activities
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review and Summary.
5. Construct a Rail Fence or Four Patch mini-quilt.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.
7. Quilt projects must be shown in the Franklin County Fair Style Review and Quilt Show.



Get Started in Art – Intermediate

1. All 11 Activities
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed final project.
5. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences, elements and principles of design and how they were used in your piece.
6. Quilt projects must be shown in the Franklin County Fair Style Review and Quilt Show.

Seeing Through Graphic Design – Intermediate

1. All 9 Activities, including a portfolio, and all of the Talking It Over questions.
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review and Summary.
5. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences, elements and principles of design and used in your work.
6. Quilt projects must be shown in the Franklin County Fair Style Review and Quilt Show.

You Can Quilt! – Intermediate

1. All 7 Activities
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review and Summary.
5. Construct a Rail Fence or Four Patch mini-quilt.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.
7. Quilt projects must be shown in the Franklin County Fair Style Review and Quilt Show.



Family History Treasure Hunt – Skill Level: N/A

1. All 4 steps in What to Do, depending on the number of years project is taken.
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review and Summary.
5. Educational display and completed project book, correspondence log, your research journal, pedigree charts, family group sheets, and documentation of your family history research as outlined on pages 3 and 4 of the project book.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.

**Do not bring computer generated programs, videos, tape recorders, photo albums, framed photos, reference books, family heirlooms, knick-knacks, or other items which do not relate to your genealogical search. **

Photography Projects

Skill Levels

Photography Basics, Book 1 – Beginner

Next Level Photography, Book 2 – Intermediate

Mastering Photography, Book 3 – Advanced

1. All 4 project areas, photo journal, and review questions.
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review.
5. Recommended to bring one of the following as an educational display:
 - A single print of any size, mounted at the discretion of the participant.
 - A collection of prints illustrating a photo story consisting of at least five and not more than ten photographs, mouted at the discretion of the participant.
 - A collection of prints illustrating one of activities the participant completed for the project, consisting of at least five and not more than ten photographs, mouted at the discretion of the participant.
6. Each participant may also bring any extra materials they feel might demonstrate their learning experiences of the current project year, but it is not required. Photochemical developing and printing maybe dones by the participant by it is not required.
7. Photo Journal – on the pages of your book or labeled accordingly in an album.
8. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.



Photography Master - Advanced

1. One major photography project.
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed project records including interview, budget, and portfolio.
5. Bring at least 1 print for display, mounted at the participants discretion, illustrating “the best” of the photographs and demonstrating the area of interest chosen to “master” in this year’s project.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.

Scrapbooking – Beginner

1. All 3 Activities (the last activity is optional)
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review.
5. Completed scrapbook.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.



The Writer in You – Intermediate (No State Fair Event)

1. All 11 Activities (including a writing portfolio) and all of the Talking It Over questions.
2. At least 2 learning experiences.
3. At least 2 leadership/citizenship activities.
4. Completed Project Review.
5. Digital copies of work must be submitted by July 1 via email to Boomershine.10@osu.edu. Each entry must be formatted 8.5 x 11 inch paper, typewritten. Stories should be double spaced. Poems should be single spaced. In order to keep track of entries, the member's full name, address , and class name should appear on the cover page.
6. Be prepared to discuss your project experiences.

Note for all writing projects: Writings must have been done for the current year. Members may not enter pieces from previous 4-H project years. Members may not submit writings they have used for a non 4-H purpose.
