FRANKLIN COUNTY 4-H NEWS - MAY 31, 2022

FAIR ENTRIES DUE JUNE 4

All 4-H projects must have a fair entry by June 4 in order to take the project to the fair.

• A fair entry is different than the 4-H project enrollment that was made by April 1.

Fair entry instructions are available on the Franklin County Fair website.

- There are two different sets of instructions on the website on the "forms" page. **One set is for the members to follow** and the other is for the club advisor.
- When you log in, use the green button to enter the email address used when you enrolled as a 4-H member earlier this year. The password is the same that you used then too.
- **LIVESTOCK PROJECTS** <u>Make sure to enter your show class.</u> Another option that you may want to make an entry for is showmanship.
- <u>VERY IMPORTANT! DO NOT CHECK OUT UNTIL ALL MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY HAVE</u>
 <u>MADE THEIR FAIR ENTRIES.</u> The system will not allow you to check out and then start
 another person's entries. Before you begin, make sure you have your whole family's entry
 information completed. If a change needs to be made, you must contact
 <u>franklincountyjuniorfair@gmail.com</u>
- If you are <u>only</u> registering your 4-H project evaluations, your balance will be \$0. Please check that option on the payment screen. Entry fees are charged for Junior Fair Special Events (example: Arrangement Challenge, Veggie Car Derby) and animals brought to the fair, not 4-H Interview Evaluations. You only pay the \$3 surcharge if you are paying with a credit card. Also, please note the difference between Open and Junior Fair Fair Special Events. You are welcome to participate in Open Class events, just know the difference, especially when signing up for Photo and Baking events.

Do you have an interest in presenting a health & safety speech or skit?

Health & Safety Speaking (2 Opportunities Available)

Health & Safety Speech

- Individual presentation
- Memorized speech on a health & safety topic relating to humans (topic ideas include: fire safety, tornado safety, farm safety, sun safety, asthma, allergies, etc.)
- Junior category (9-13 years old) speech is 2 ½ to 3 ½ minutes long
- Senior category (14 years and up) speech is 4 to 5 ½ minutes long

Health & Safety Skit

- Team of 2-5 4-Hers (ages 8-18)
- Each member must have at least 1 minute of total speaking time (does not mean 1 minute of continued speaking)
- Time Requirement: 5-8 minutes
- Choose a health or safety topic that affects family living (in the home, on the farm, on the highway, or in a public place).
- Skit should be prepared by the 4-H members participating in the contest
- Local example and supporting statistics (with sources cited) are required

How can you help? There are four main ways you can support the Franklin County Fair Family Fun Day:


- Set up a display table in the Entertainment Tent from Noon-4:00 pm.

OHIO STATE FAIR VIRTUAL SKILLATHON






