to her involvement in 4-H showing goats, rabbits, and various special interest projects from dog care and training to baking. As a member of the junior fair board, she worked closely with extension and the senior fair board members to ensure the fair season was successful for all 4-H exhibitors

Food insecurity is a big issue with many of the families in our community, and Harley looks forward to using her Public Health background to improve this problem. 
