OSU EXTENSION, FRANKLIN COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

In the last year OSU Extension, Franklin County¹ has:

- Offered money management workshops to 250 Franklin County residents, HUD-certified homebuyer education to 164 prospective buyers, and free computer classes to 81 adults
- Reached 1,415 residents through the Supplemental Nutrition
 Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) and 228 residents, which
 impacted 1,244 family members, through the Expanded Food and
 Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP)
- Provided health and wellness programs for 334 senior citizens
- Guided 820 youth through Franklin County 4-H, empowering them to master lifelong skills while completing a total of 1,700 projects
- Reached more than 12,000 youth through in-school and after-school enrichment programs
- Managed 171 Master Gardener Volunteers, who donated more than 8,300 hours of volunteer service throughout the county
- Educated 6,179 individuals on various agriculture and natural resources topics and assisted 780 Franklin County residents through the Garden Info-line, staffed by Master Gardener Volunteers
