#### Food for a Long Life (FFLL)

# A USDA-CYFAR (Children, Youth and Families at Risk) funded project with Ohio State University and Virginia Cooperative Extension

**Program Objective:** To support healthy food access, consumption, and knowledge among young children (birth – age 5), older adults (age 60+), and their families in the Near East Side of Columbus (zip codes 43203 & 43205) and Lynchburg, Virginia. We use community based practices to achieve these goals with intergenerational strategies and sustainable partnerships.

### **Ohio Program Requirements:**

- 1. OSU Extension staff from Franklin County will collaborate with community partners to pursue goals that align with the FFLL program objective. Examples include but are not limited to programs supporting home vegetable gardens, community gardening, and education about healthy food for families, older adults, and/or young children in zip codes 43203 & 43205.
- 2. A letter from each partnering agency or organization (excluding Extension) must be submitted outlining their contribution to the project and how staff from OSU Extension Franklin County will be involved.
- 3. A one-page proposal outlining: (a) objectives related to current and/or potential initiatives that align with FFLL, (b) strategies to achieve the objectives, (c) a timeline, (d) indication that approval required by the organization and partners to implement the proposal has been secured, and (e) a budget of up to \$10,000 (see template on next page)
  - a. Budgeted items may support: wages, continuing education, technology, and materials, including food purchased for programming such as instruction or demonstrations
  - b. Budgeted items may <u>not</u> include: building construction\*, gift cards, promotional materials (e.g., t-shirts), postage or food as a meal or incentive for participation
    - \*Funds may not be used for the construction or remodeling of spaces designed for human occupancy. Funds may be used for infrastructure improvements that support the FFLL program objective such as raised beds, fencing, storage sheds, coverings for educational or market spaces and water access for gardens
- 4. Funds must be expended by August 31, 2021. Funds will be distributed upon confirmation that the grantee is a vendor in the OSU payment system, or upon setup of the grantee as a vendor, which is contingent upon the submission of an approved scope of work that will be based on the grant application.
- 5. A summary of how well project objectives were achieved and how grant funds supported progress towards the FFLL program objective must be reported to Jenny Lobb, Extension Educator, via email (<a href="lobb.3@osu.edu">lobb.3@osu.edu</a>) by September 30, 2021. In other words, grantees will describe how they know the project was a success. Please see the <a href="CYFAR common measures">CYFAR common measures</a> for examples of metrics to report; Jenny Lobb can consult with grantees on appropriate indicators to track and report.
- 6. Proposals are due by 11:59 pm on Sunday, May 9. Proposals must be emailed to Jenny Lobb, Extension Educator at <a href="lobb.3@osu.edu">lobb.3@osu.edu</a>. If possible, please submit your proposal and letter(s) of support as a single file. Applicants will be notified of decisions by May 21.

# **Proposal Example**

#### **Project Name:**

Project Summary: ABC Gardens began researching, assembling, and distributing home garden kits in 2017, with annual growth of 10% until 2020 when requests for the kits grew 50% to 80 kits. Among our family gardeners, 50% have children under 18 years of age; 20% of these families have children ages 5 and under. With these kits, families have produced up to 25 pounds of produce each growing season, building skills and increasing access to and consumption of healthy foods. Franklin County Extension, Master Gardeners and ABC Garden staff assemble the materials, orient home gardeners, and provide support through the growing season. With requests for the kits exceeding our current capacity to purchase materials and provide family gardeners with support, the current proposal seeks funds for materials and personnel support to expand the number of kits delivered to families in the XYZ community in summer 2021. Families will benefit by building knowledge about growing food that helps meet their family's need for nutritious produce and by connecting with Extension professionals, ABC Gardens, and other community members as they build community around home gardening.
